

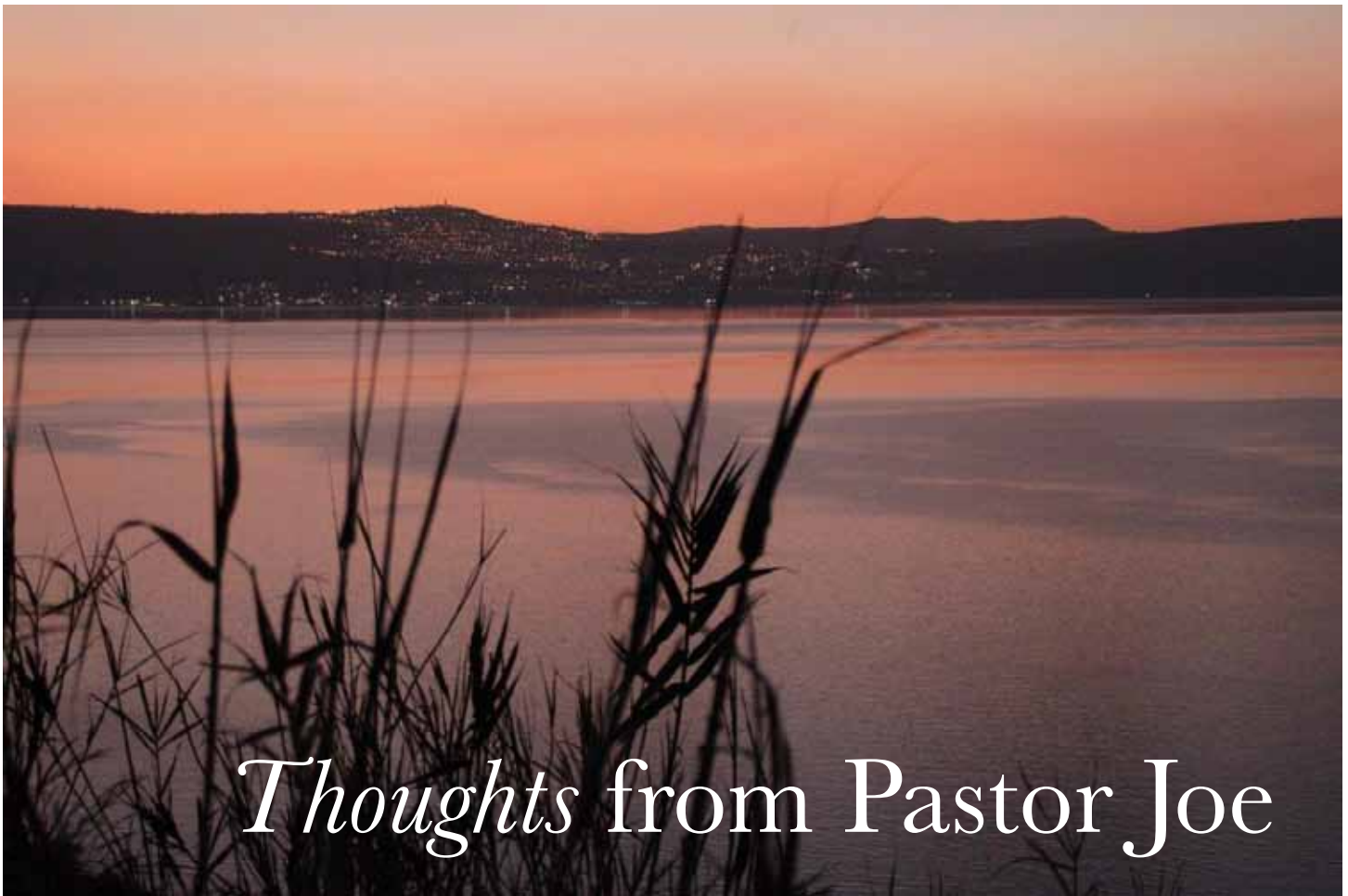

# *Thoughts from Pastor Joe*

**A**braham Lincoln is dead...though you probably already know that. Still, for someone who enjoys history as do I, it is interesting to visit some of the places that were significant in his life: Gettysburg, Ford's Theatre in Washington D.C. You get something of a sense of the man and of standing in the current of history when you visit some of those sites.

Even more than Lincoln, I am a student of John and Robert Kennedy. So, when we lived in Massachusetts we would regularly take visitors down to the Cape and past the Kennedy Compound in Hyannis Port. I also enjoyed going to the Kennedy Library. John Kennedy's sailboat sits on a spit of land that juts into Boston Harbor, in front of the Library.

Something of the same kind of feeling came across me when visiting biblical sites in Israel in November. Seeing the caves where David spared Saul's life at Ein Gedi (1 Samuel 24), or visiting Qumran where the Essenes wrote their Dead Sea Scrolls, or standing at the top of Mt. Carmel where Elijah challenged the false prophets of Baal (1 Kings 18) made those stories take on a new immediacy. Huddling in the half-light and breathing the heavy air of a room, now buried beneath the streets of current Jerusalem, where the Sanhedrin may have met and ordered Peter and the apostles to stop talking about Jesus in the weeks and months following

Jesus' resurrection (an order, by the way, which they refused to follow; Acts 5), and the place where Stephen was put on trial (Acts 7), is like breathing in the air of history. Perhaps, I wondered, if I listened very carefully, might I still hear the fading echoes of those voices, filled with the courage of the Holy Spirit, ever so faintly glancing off the stone walls?

One morning Barbie and I got up early and walked the fifty yards down to the beach from our room on the shores of the Sea of Galilee. It was just before sunrise. The white-washed walls of the city of Tiberius, across the lake, were beginning to gleam in the light of the new day. We stood for a time and looked at the calm water and the surrounding hillsides. I balanced on a rock and dipped my fingers into the water. The world was quiet and most people were still in their rooms. And I thought about how I was experiencing a scene that in many ways looked just as it had looked when Jesus stood on the edge of that same lake on a quiet morning when the sun began to rise. Perhaps it was the day he was preparing to walk into the lives of Peter and James and John and invite them to follow him (Luke 5). Maybe it was just like this the morning he decided to go up on a mountainside and begin to teach (Matthew 5). That night a sudden, strong wind came up, bending the trees and the tall grass before its force, driving whitecaps across the water. What was it like, I thought, to be the disciples, caught in an unexpected storm,

waves just like these pounding the side of their boat as Jesus slept in the back, until he got up and spoke the wind and waves into silence and made the water as calm as it had been when we walked to the beach that morning?

There's a fundamental difference, though, an essential distinction between standing next to the Sea of Galilee or walking the Via Dolorosa from the place where Jesus was condemned to the spot of his crucifixion on the one hand, and entering Ford's Theatre or touching John Kennedy's sailboat. Lincoln and Kennedy are dead, their legacies frozen in time, their history forever a part of the past. But Jesus? He's alive. He is *now*. The morning I stood on the Sea of Galilee, Jesus was present with me in a way no other historical figure can be. Just as he had been there once, he was there that morning. These were the places – Capernaum, Jerusalem, the rocky shore of Galilee – he was, but these *are* the places – Santa Clarita, CLC, our homes and families – he *is*. Jesus is a dynamic, living being with whom I can have a present-moment relationship and whose love impacts my life today and whose call to me transforms my life.

That's the significance of the prolog to John's Gospel. Jesus was in the beginning. But he became flesh and dwelt among us. And it is through him that we see the full glory of God, and it is through him that we receive blessing upon blessing. Jesus can't be bound to history; he doesn't exist back there somewhere, he lives now and rules eternally.

I am really looking forward to two things. Beginning the first Sunday in January, Pastor Mike and I will spend the weeks through Easter walking with you through John's version of Jesus' story, spending time with the One whose story continues on into our lives. I invite you to meet Jesus again, just as I met him again on the shores of Galilee. And on Wednesday, January 4 at 6PM and repeated at 7PM the group from CLC who went to Israel and I will share a presentation of pictures and video from our pilgrimage. I hope you can be with us.

# Council Corner

The Church Council has been busy this year preparing for the future – God’s best is yet to come! A proposed budget has been finalized for approval at the January annual meeting. Benevolence giving will again be focused on three areas: Local, Global and Lutheran specific projects. Your support allows for God’s best to reach out through areas such as Hands & Hearts, Lutheran Social Services, Winter Shelter, Food Pantry and other Lutheran mission congregations.

A new proposed constitution will also be presented at the annual meeting for approval. The existing constitution was based on ELCA affiliation and did not reflect the growth in Christ Lutheran Church. There are certain core Lutheran beliefs that are confirmed in this new constitution. Additionally, the proposal moves certain items that are more appropriate to be addressed by Policy and Procedure.

Have you experienced areas in the sanctuary where the sound just isn’t clear? Council has been working on correcting this. Earlier this year a study was completed to evaluate the acoustics and determine possible corrections. The improvements may involve several steps with the focus on managing the cost and evaluating the result before proceeding to the next effort. Before the end of the year, sound system demonstrations will have been completed by AMT and Prime Directive. Based on this outcome, look for proposals to be considered at the annual meeting.

## *From Pastor Mike*

I grew up driving in snow. In Minnesota, there is snow or ice on the roads a good 330 days out of the year so you just learn how to deal with it. All the winter driving instincts are burned into my brain from all the years of driving in soft snow, wet snow, snow on top of ice (that is the worst), freezing rain, and black ice. The average Minnesotan will steer into a skid and pump the brakes before they even realize the car is sliding. We even teach it to our preschoolers. I might be exaggerating a little, but only a little. I didn't realize how 'normal' it was, until I was driving with a friend of mine from California. He was agog at how all the Minnesotans just drove as if nothing was unusual. The thing is that if you know how to do it, and practice it, it isn't unusual.

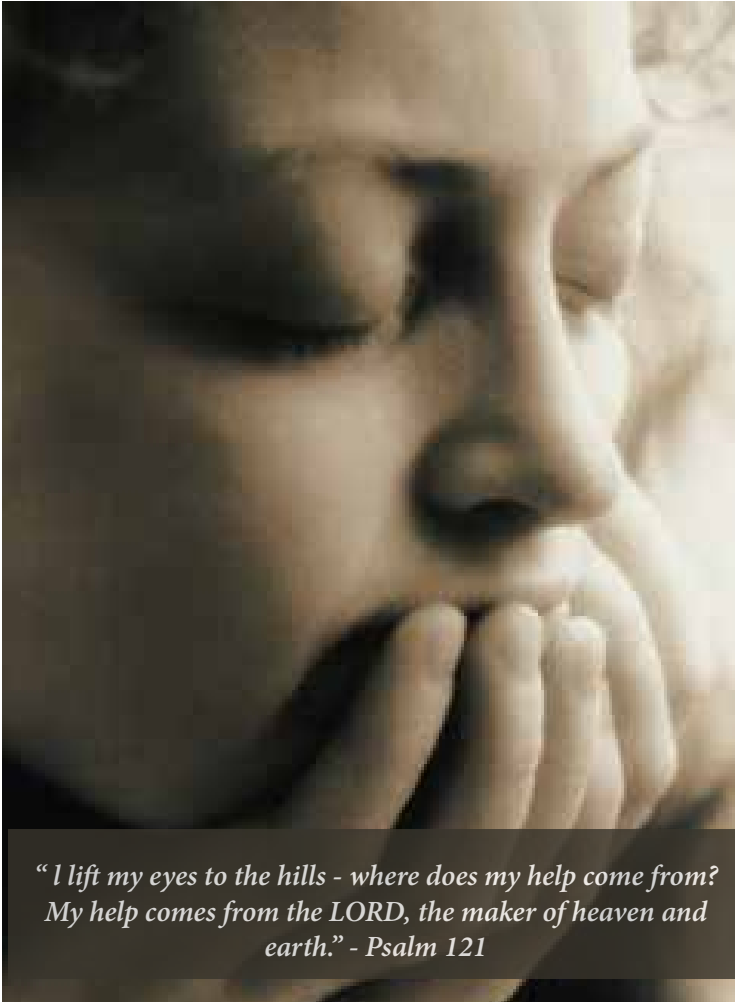


Here is the thing though, just as those driving habits are built into our hind brain, so are the ways we think about God. When some crisis hits us, we don't think, we react. And we react with the habits that we have built up. Inertia can rule our thinking. When we aren't in our Bibles and we aren't praying and we aren't in worship, we react to the icy patches in our lives without God. We trust our own instincts and that is where we get in trouble. The key to driving on ice and the key to living in difficult times is building up your good habits before things start to slide. That way, when you run into trouble, you are prepared. By the time you hit the rough patch it is too late.

The beginning of the New Year is one of those times to get into new habits. Take a look and see what you want your habits to be. We have a ton of opportunities for you to learn, study, and grow. There are all sorts of bible studies on and off campus, the pastors lead a Wednesday night bible study that parallels the Sunday morning sermon and we have a new opportunity I would like to let you in on.

This year, we will be blogging through the bible. Each week, Pastor Joe and I will take a chapter of the bible and write about it in the blog. We'll start with the book of Acts. Every week, you can read that one chapter, and get our comments on it. If you have never read the book of Acts, you are in for a ride. It is a great book that covers the story of the early church. It has it all, amazing courage, daring escapes, and a lot of the Holy Spirit. # The God Compartment

As most people know, men are famous for being able to compartmentalize their lives. There's the "work compartment", the "home compartment", the "church compartment", the "kid compartment", the "sports compartment", the "wife compartment", etc., and rarely do these compartments intermix. Women, however, have no dividing walls...it's all a big mish-mash of stuff, all bleeding over, one huge bowl of life. It occurred to me, as I was pondering this ancient truth, that God does not recognize compartments. From God's perspective, we are all people with one life to live. We can choose to honor Him with that life or not.

This has many ramifications for us humans. The biggest dividing wall humans have erected is the one between secular and religious. Can we honestly imagine our great Creator gazing at this flimsy wall of separation and saying, "Yeah, you're right, I really have no business having an opinion about those things...they're "secular" concerns." ? Our God is omnipotent and omnipresent and has dominion over all the earth and everything in it...He has legitimate concerns for how we govern our nations. God does not believe in "secular". To Him there is no such thing.

Then there is the dividing wall between religions. Again, imagine God being told by humans that, according to their particular beliefs, He has several arms and shares power with several co-gods and goddesses, or maybe, He created the world but He

doesn't really pay any attention anymore, or He will banish all humans back to the earth until they achieve perfection on their own, or that He demands strict ritualistic living in order for Him to consider your entry to heaven. Imagine Him being told that He is made in whatever image the humans dream up, and not the other way around. God probably laughs and says, "I told you all about myself and my nature in a book, and to prove it I sent my only Son to sacrifice Himself to make things right again, just like the book told you He would. Then He rose from the dead! Have any of your other imaginings of me even come close to the reality of my Son raising from the dead?"

This brings us to our own personal dividing walls. We all do it to some extent, even us women. We believe in God, but we put Him in a box: "My 'God compartment' includes church on Sunday and bringing my kids to Wednesday night programs", "I don't get to church every Sunday, but I think about God while I'm not there", "I don't think you need to be in church to be a Christian, besides, Sunday is my only free day!", "God knows my heart, He understands". We consider ourselves Christian, but we do not put God in His place of honor in our lives. We wear a cross, yet seek entertainment that glorifies sin. We spend Sunday in church after an evening of heavy drinking. Our kids have a sleep-over, they're too tired for Sunday School, oh well...maybe we'll make it next week. The guys at work love to hear your dirty jokes, it's just at work! Even laundry takes priority over worship. I urge you to see this from God's perspective. Look at all the barriers these dividing walls have become, keeping you from a true intimate relationship with your Creator and Redeemer. When God looks down on your life, He does not see a little compartment you've reserved for Him and say, "That's cool, at least I got a piece of his/her life". He grieves because you have not given Him your whole heart. He wants you desperately, for your own good! Our God is a jealous God, He wants all of you. Because when He has all of you, He knows you will be with Him for eternity.

As we begin a new year, lift up the walls of separation in your God compartment, let Him flow out and spill over into all the areas of your life. Home, work, kids, spouse, fun, God wants to be honored in all things, and He does not honor those compartments!

## VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL


The VBS dates have been set for June 18 - 22, 2012. We will be using Group Curriculum again with the theme "Sky", Where Everything is Possible With God.

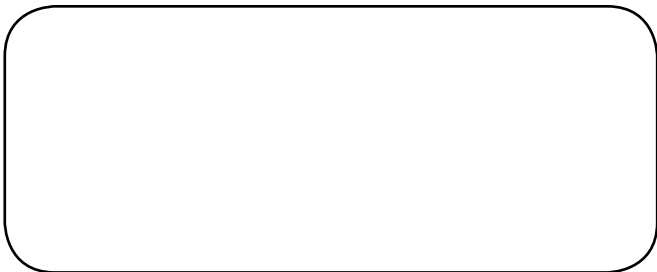
